The EPA has an online mapping system called EJScreen (https://www.epa.gov/ejscreen) that can be used to map a suite of population related data (population, poverty, income, etc.) and environmental hazards in an area without having to know GIS. It is possible to add data to EJScreen. To add other data in EJScreen, click on:

Add Maps > Search for Maps > Add Map Services, and add the URL to the map service of interest, such as the PAD-US WMS:

Users can then explore population and environmental hazards around an individual park.

EarthExplorer – is especially useful for older aerial photographs. https://earthexplorer.usgs.gov/
